

turned their backs on him, claiming the Diocese wanted him to cover up the allegations.

"The phrase they used was, 'you don't think like the rest of us," said Gallagher, who claimed the Diocese later defamed him in church as retaliation.

It was reported in 2016 that, according to Gallagher's lawsuit, the bishop ordered a statement be read in all masses that January, telling worshipers Gallagher was making unfounded allegations.

"Fr Gallagher was called essentially crazy, he was called

a liar, that's not true," said Babbitt.

Late last year, the Florida Supreme Court said it would not hear the case, deciding it wasn't in their jurisdiction.

Gallagher and his attorney said the church should not be immune from civil suits that have nothing to do with church doctrine.

"This is about the protection of minors, protection of children and the vulnerable, and if there's no protection for the person who will speak out on their behalf and be their voice, then we have a serious problem," said Gallagher.

Sunday World Fr Gallag he felt "utterly betrayed", not only by the Catholic Church, but by his own former priest friends as well.

"After giving 30 years of your life to the church it has been very traumatic that I can't even go to church as I had done every day," he said.

"I haven't been to mass in well over a year because I'm persona non-grata with the Catholic Church

"They blackened my name and ruined my reputation when they had priests in the diocese read out a statement at mass that was a liar and was mentally ill."
